

Revised Paediatric Sepsis Clinical Pathway Factsheet

Background

Sepsis represents a leading cause of preventable death and persistent harm for children in Queensland. An evidence based Paediatric Sepsis Clinical Pathway was implemented in 16 HHS Emergency Departments (ED) in Queensland and 80 rural and remote sites as part of the [Clinical Excellence Sepsis Breakthrough Collaborative Project](#) in 2019/2020

Many advancements have since been made including:

- an 18-month trial in 2020/2021 piloting a Paediatric Sepsis Inpatient Pathway in 8 paediatric wards across the state
- the development of a [Sepsis Clinical Care Standard](#) to improve the standards of care across the country and
- ongoing feedback from consumers wanting consistent information and support throughout their sepsis journey.

To meet these needs, the Pathway has been revised to extend beyond the acute resuscitation and treatment bundle into a sepsis management plan now covering the whole sepsis episode from presentation to discharge home.

About the revised Paediatric Sepsis Pathway

The revised Paediatric Sepsis Pathway is based on international best practice and incorporates input from a broad range of paediatric experts and consumers across the state.

The ED Tertiary and Secondary, ED Rural and Remote and Paediatric Sepsis Inpatient Pathways have now been combined into one single pathway that is suitable regardless of location.

Newly included in this paper pathway:

- monitoring and reassessment guide
- comprehensive management plan
- information sheet for parents and carers of a child diagnosed with sepsis

Updated content includes:

- screening and recognition tool
- antimicrobial guidelines
- sepsis checklist for families

The revised Pathway has been reviewed and evaluated by an independent human factors expert to ensure clarity, usability, and alignment with the national Sepsis Clinical Care standard.

Clinical pathways never replace clinical judgement. Use this pathway in children younger than 16 years. 16-18 year olds may use the adult or paediatric sepsis clinical pathway.

SCREEN AND RECOGNISE

Could it be sepsis?
☐ Signs of infection or history and evidence of fever or hypothermia
PLUS ANY of the following
☐ Looks sick or toxic ☐ Altered behaviour or reduced level of consciousness
☐ Parental, carer or clinician concern ☐ Age younger than 3 months
☐ Re-presentation with same illness ☐ Sepsis admission within the last 30 days
☐ Immunocompromised ☐ Abnormal or Tones Strait Islander person
*For Oncology patients refer to 'Management of Suspected Neutropenic Sepsis Pathway (SW796)'

Document full set of observations in CEWT including blood pressure and AVPU

Does the patient have ANY features of severe illness?
☐ Severe respiratory distress, tachypnoea or apnoea (CEWT respiratory score 3) ☐ Altered AVPU
☐ Severe tachycardia (CEWT heart rate score 3) ☐ Poor skin perfusion or cold extremities
☐ Hypotension (CEWT blood pressure score 2) ☐ Lactate ≥2mmol/L (if known)
Other laboratory features of severe illness (if known):
☐ Low platelets ☐ Elevated creatinine ☐ Elevated INR or bilirubin ☐ Elevated CRP
These laboratory tests are not mandatory

Do you still suspect sepsis?
YES: Patient MAY have sepsis
• Targeted history and examination
• Obtain senior medical review or consider calling RSQ 1300 799 127
• Immediate monitoring in close observation area
THEN: Senior medical review attended: ☐ : ☐ (24hr)
Does the senior clinician think sepsis is likely?
☐ Yes – sepsis with shock ☐ Yes – sepsis without shock OR ☐ Unlikely sepsis
NO: Patient UNLIKELY to have sepsis now
• Reassess and escalate as indicated
THEN: ☐ Give Paediatric Sepsis Checklist to parent or carer (tear off back page)

Sepsis has been diagnosed by a senior medical doctor
Start resuscitation and treatment for sepsis NOW (next page)
Escalate to MET, PICU, ICU or RSQ 1300 799 127
