Child Health Service

Pre-Referral Guidelines

The Child Health Service provides a range of free community health and support services for children and their parents/carers to give every child the best possible start in life.

Referral Pathways

There are TWO pathways to access the Child Health Service:

- 1. Parents/Carers self-refer to the following services (no referral required):
 - Parenting and Support Early Feeding Drop-In Clinics (brief intervention for babies 0-12 weeks post discharge from maternity hospital)
 - · Initial home visit by a Child Health Nurse for all families with an infant up to 4 months of age
 - Key Age Assessments as per Personal Health Record recommendations
 - · Additional child health consultations as needed
 - · Ongoing infant/child feeding support
 - Parent Groups New Parent Groups (0-3 months), Child Health and Parenting Seminars (4-6 months and 10-12 months), Group Triple P (Parents/Carers of children 2-8 years).

If a family has any barriers to accessing the services above, a referral can be completed to support them in the booking process. A booking officer will then contact the parent/carer and arrange an appointment.

- 2. Health Professional referral required for the following services:
 - · Health assessments requiring multidisciplinary support and monitoring e.g. secondary developmental screening
 - Early Intervention Clinician a psychologist or social worker to provide parenting support
 - Infant Feeding and Parenting Support Program extended consultation of up to six hours
 - Postnatal Wellbeing Group for mother's experiencing difficulties adjusting to parenting or have mild-to-moderate postnatal depression and/or anxiety
 - Circle of Security Parenting Group helping parents and caregivers to strengthen the parenting connection.

Referred clients may require an initial appointment with a Child Health Nurse for assessment.
