## Admission rule (paediatric) short stay unit (ESSU)

### FirstNet

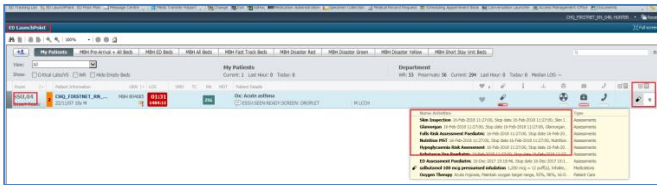
#### Quick reference guide

The Paediatric Admission Rule fires when a patient is admitted an Inpatient Unit at LCCH.

The Paediatric Admission Rule order will display activities/tasks needing to be documented when patients are admitted to ESSU previously captured on the paper Short Stay Unit care plan.

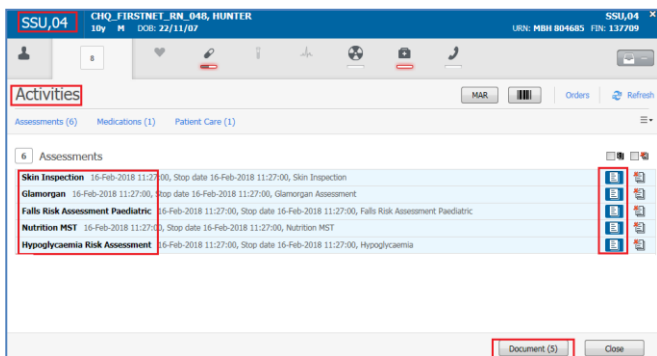
1. The ESSU nurse will be able to see the Admission Rule tasks on the **Nurses Activity column** on LaunchPoint.

Click on the activities number in LaunchPoint.

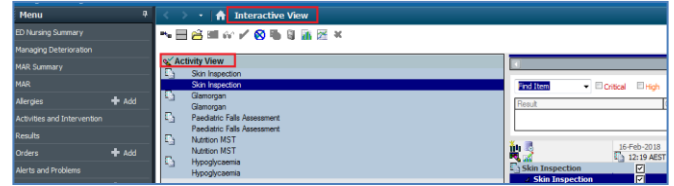


2. In **LaunchPoint summary** the admission rules have displayed.

Select the activities that will be documented against. Click **Document (5)**.



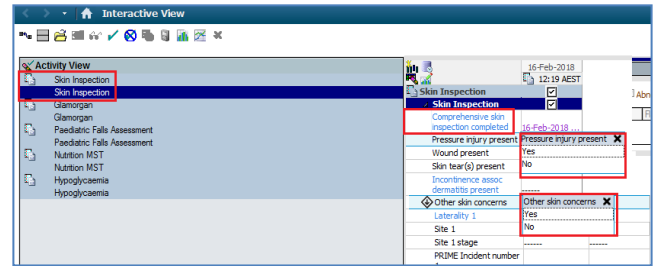
3. The tasks open in the Activity view on iView.



### Skin Inspection

1. Enter data only in clinically relevant cells.

If the clinician identifies a Pressure area concern the details can be captured in the Other Skin concerns. Note that the **Riskman** incident report number will be entered into the Prime data cell.



### Hypoglycaemia

1. **Hypoglycaemia assessment** is to identify children who are most at risk of dropping the BGL e.g. infants fasting for OT predispose to being at a higher risk e.g. metabolic patients.

### Glamorgan



1. Enter the cells to generate a **Glamorgan Score**.

2. If a Glamorgan score is  $> 0$  click on the **Blue Glamorgan hyperlink** to open a support decision screen.

Total Glamorgan	15
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Risk Score	Category	Suggested Action
10+	At risk	Inspect skin at least twice a day. Relieve pressure by helping child to move at least every 2 hours. Use an age and weight appropriate pressure redistribution surface for sitting on / sleeping on.
15+	High risk	Inspect skin with each positioning. Reposition child / equipment / devices at least every 2 hours. Relieve pressure before any skin redness develops. Use an age and weight appropriate pressure redistribution surface for sitting on / sleeping on.
20+	Very high risk	Inspect skin at least hourly. Move or turn if possible, before skin becomes red. Ensure equipment / objects are not pressing on the skin. Consider using specialised pressure relieving equipment.

### Nutrition Assessment

1. Enter assessment and refer to **Dieticians** if appropriate.

1. Complete the **Paediatric Falls Assessment** to identify the patient's risk of fall. Click on the **blue hyperlinks** to open decision support information.

### Substance Use

1. The **Paediatric Substance Use** will only fire for patients  $> 11$  years old. **Part A** should be completed for all patients. If a patient answers yes to any question in Part A then all questions in **Part B** should be asked, otherwise only question 1 in Part B should be asked.
