Haemophilia

When and who to contact

General Practitioner or Medical Centre

It is very important that your child has a regular general practitioner (GP) as this is your link to a health care provider in the community. Your GP can help you and your child manage common childhood illnesses not related to your blood disorder, regular vaccinations, and health care referrals to specialists.

Sick Day Action Plan (for conditions unrelated to haemophilia)

Sometimes children with haemophilia will have common childhood illnesses or conditions, such as cold or flu like symptoms, ear infections and skin conditions. If you are experiencing any of these symptoms you should visit your GP or nearest medical centre to have your child reviewed. If your GP has further concerns, he/she can contact your health care team. **If your child has a port-a-cath and has any fever greater than 38° you must contact your haemophilia team.** An infection in the port-a-cath is always suspected when a child with a port-a-cath has a fever.

Medical Emergency Action Plan (related to haemophilia)

You will have been given specific information related to your child's haemophilia and the warning signs of a more serious condition. Your health care team considers these symptoms a sign of an emergency and you should take immediate action. Please contact the Haemophilia team for advice or present to your nearest hospital emergency department. If your child is very unwell call for an ambulance on 000.

Symptoms

Some of the symptoms that may indicate a serious condition include

- Bleeding into a joint or muscle; swollen, warm or very painful joint /muscle.
- Any head injury including a change in level of consciousness.
- Nose bleed not stopping after 20 minutes after applying constant pressure.
- Shivering/ unwell / feels cold after accessing the port-a-cath, including pale with no energy or rigors (shivers and shakes.)
- If your child has a port-a-cath and has any fever greater than 38°.
- Difficulty breathing
- If you are not sure if the bleed is serious or not and/or if the bleed is not resolving after two doses of factor.

REMEMBER: Your child will be seen by a doctor in the Emergency department. The Emergency team will contact the haematology consultant on call to discuss your child's condition.

- **Blood results** (Urgent/ Routine test/ Follow up) - Your health care team will contact you if required.

- **Medication Scripts**

Ideally scripts should be requested at your regular review appointment. If your child has a repeat prescription please check with Pharmacy how many repeats you have left and if you need a new script.
